Department of Veterans Affairs Voluntary Service National Advisory Committee

Charter

- **1. Official Designation.** Department of Veteran Affairs (VA) Voluntary Service National Advisory Committee (the Committee).
- 2. Authority. The Committee is established under agency authority and in accordance with the provisions of the Federal Advisory Committee Act, as amended, 5 U.S.C. 10.
- 3. Objectives and Scope of Activities. The VA Voluntary Service (VAVS) National Advisory Committee provides advice to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, through the Under Secretary for Health, on the coordination and promotion of volunteer activities within VA health care facilities and on other matters relating to volunteerism.
- **4. Description of Duties.** The Committee serves in an advisory capacity by making recommendations to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, through the Under Secretary for Health, for the improvement of voluntary services to Veteran-patients by means of coordination on a national level of the established plans and policies for community volunteer participation.
- **5. Official to Whom the Committee Reports.** The Committee reports to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs through the Under Secretary for Health.
- **6. Office Responsible for Providing the Support to the Committee.** Support is provided by the Veterans Health Administration, through the offices of the Deputy Assistant Under Secretary for Health for Operations and the VA Center for Development and Civic Engagement.
- **7. Estimated Annual Operating Costs in Dollars and Staff-Years.** Annual operating costs of the Committee are estimated at \$615,764 for two full-time equivalent staff and associated costs to facilitate meetings.
- **8. Designated Federal Officer.** The Designated Federal Officer (DFO), a full time VA employee, will approve the schedule of committee and subcommittee meetings. The DFO, or a designee, will be present at all Committee and subcommittee meetings, and each meeting will be conducted in accordance with an agenda approved by the DFO. The DFO is authorized to adjourn any meeting when he or she determines it is in the public interest to do so.
- **9. Estimated Number and Frequency of Committee Meetings.** Committee meetings are held annually, and subcommittees meet on an as needed basis.

- **10. Duration.** There is a continuing need for the Committee to provide advice to the Secretary of Veterans Affairs regarding the coordination and promotion of volunteer activities at VA health care facilities.
- **11. Termination Date.** Unless renewed by appropriate action prior to its expiration, the Committee will terminate 2 years from the filing date below.
- 12. Membership and Designation. With the exception of the Chairperson and Deputy Chairperson, who are Regular Government Employees, all members of the Committee are named by national organizations involved in VA volunteer activities. Organizations may each designate a VAVS National Representative and VAVS Deputy National Representatives. Organizational membership on the Committee includes the following seven categories: Service (voting); Associate Service; Donor; Associate Donor; Adjunct Membership for youth organizations; Strategic Engagement; and Honorary. The Committee will be composed of approximately 155 members, depending on the number and size of national organizations supporting VAVS volunteer activities.
- 13. Subcommittees. With the DFO's approval, the Committee is authorized to establish subcommittees to perform specific projects or assignments as necessary and consistent with its mission. The Committee Chairperson shall notify the Secretary of Veterans Affairs, through the DFO, of the establishment of any subcommittee, including its function, membership and estimated duration. The objectives of the subcommittees are to make recommendations to the chartered Committee with respect to matters related to the responsibilities of the chartered Committee. Such subcommittees may not work independently of the chartered Committee and must report their recommendations and advice to the full Committee for full deliberation and discussion. Subcommittees have no authority to make decisions on behalf of the parent Committee nor can they report directly to VA.
- **14. Recordkeeping.** Records of the Committee shall be handled in accordance with General Records Schedule 6.2 or other approved agency records disposition schedules. Those records shall be available for public inspection and copying, subject to the Freedom of Information Act, 5 U.S.C. § 552.
