

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A higher percent American Indian/Alaska Native Veterans have served in Post-9/11 and Pre-9/11 than Veterans of all other races.

(in percent)


■ AIAN ■ All Other Races



The difference between the percentages for AIAN Veterans and Veterans of all other races during the Vietnam era and peacetime only are not statistically significant. Statistical testing assessed significance at the 90 percent confidence level.

Approximately 9.3 million Veterans used at least one VA benefit or service in FY 2013.
40% of all VA users received benefits or services from multiple programs.*

VA Benefits Utilization by Program - Veterans only: 2013




* The numbers from the chart do not sum to the total number of VA users. Veterans who used multiple programs are counted in each individual program, but only once in the overall total.

Occupations of Veterans by Gender: 2013 (in percent)





Minority Veterans had lower labor force participation (LFP) rates than non-Veterans.
